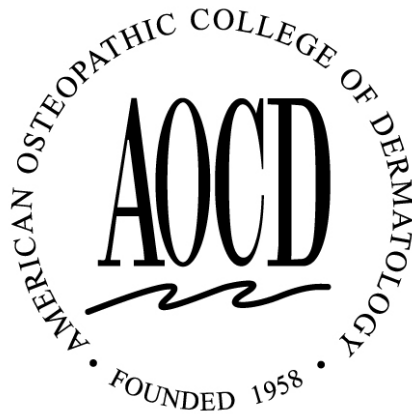
Directions to the Hotel
